Winter Safety

- 1. Wrap your outdoor faucets and attic water pipes with shipping bubble wrap. Seal it with duct tape. Then, even if it rains or snows the layer of ice outside the bubble wrap acts as an additional layer of insulation.
- 2. Bring all your rechargeable tool batteries inside. They don't withstand freezing well. Once inside, let them warm up to room temperature before recharging. Then charge them all in case you need to use the tools (in my case, a chain saw) during or after the freeze.
 - 3. Just to be on the safe side, fill a few gallon jugs with water. You probably won't need them, but even if you don't you can use them afterward to fill your water filter or to water your plants.
- 4. If you have a propane torch, locate it now. Even if your pipes don't freeze, your neighbors' might.
- 5. Fill the gas tank on your car/truck now. Gas may be hard to find if the power is down for an extended time. If you have some gas cans, fill those too.
- 6. If you have a BBQ pit, be sure it has fuel. Propane-powered cooking comes in handy during extended power outages.
- 7. If you have a portable generator, test it now to ensure that the motor runs.
- 8. If your generator is anywhere near your house, make sure you have a portable CO (Carbon Monoxide) detector with an alarm and keep it in your living areas.
