OSHA Alliance Meeting Summary 08/14/2025

The Safe + Sound campaign, held from August 11-15, 2025, recognizes workplace safety achievements and provides resources for emergency preparedness, urging companies to 'act not react' through measures like practicing emergency drills.

OSHA Penalty Reductions

OSHA is offering significant penalty reductions to encourage small businesses to invest in safety. The new model for small businesses includes those with up to 25 employees (previously 15). Reductions are available for serious violations (up to 70%) and willful violations (up to 80%). Additional reductions of up to 25% are possible for genuine safety efforts, 15% for quick issue resolution, and 20% for businesses with no serious violations in the past five years. This aims to help small businesses improve safety without being overwhelmed by fines.

Louisiana Statistics and Initiatives

Louisiana has a notably low number of OSHA compliance officers, with only seven currently, down from a previous high of 18. The state's leading cause of workplace fatalities is "struck by" incidents, not falls, which is the national number one cause. Since October 2024, there have been 35 male fatalities, with an average age of 41. The state has also seen a rise in hospitalizations from chemical exposure. Due to these trends, OSHA is increasing its focus on the oil & gas, maritime, and construction industries.

Available Resources

OSHA offers various resources to help businesses, especially small ones. The OSHA On-Site Consultation Program provides free, confidential, and non-enforcement assistance to help identify workplace hazards. They also have publications and a newsletter called Quick Takes. Additionally, the agency is promoting a Compliance Assistance Outreach program using VPP (Voluntary Protection Programs) companies to mentor others seeking VPP status.

Upcoming Campaigns

OSHA continues to promote its Heat Illness Prevention campaign and will focus on Suicide Prevention and Disaster Preparedness in the coming month. The agency's calendar highlights monthly topics such as Fall Protection, Construction Safety, and Trench Safety.
